Keep PowerPoint design consistent with a theme. When you use a PowerPoint theme, choose one that will not weaken your classroom presentation. Test it ahead of time to make sure that the text will be readable and visual graphics won't get lost in the background. Limit the use of animation and transition effects.

20 Basic PowerPoint Guidelines to Design Effective ...

Suggestion 1: Keep it Simple. A popular rule of thumb is no more than 5 (+/- 2) points on a slide. A more useful rule of thumb may be no more than 1 idea per slide. A good slide guides the viewer towards the essence of an idea, rather than listing of the idea's attributes. Suggestion 2: Less is More (More or less)

Guidelines For Student Presentations In Class Page 3 of 3 STAND: don't lean or crouch forward on the podium. Don't sit on the table. Also, don't create unnecessary personal distractions, like wearing a hat or sunglasses (unless needed for medical reasons), or constantly having to flip your hair back or pull it behind your ears.

For students this would include: the size and color of fonts, the relationship between images and text on the screen, the motion path of text animation and slide transitions, as well as any hand gestures, facial expressions, or classroom demonstrations made by the instructor.

Follow the 5/5/5 rule. To keep your audience from feeling overwhelmed, you should keep the text on each slide short and to the point. Some experts suggest using the 5/5/5 rule: no more than five words per line of text, five lines of text per slide, or five text-heavy slides in a row.

Guidelines for Oral Presentations

PowerPoint allows the presenter to jump ahead or back without having to page through all the interim slides. • Know how to and practice moving forward AND backward within your presentation. Students may ask to see the previous screen again. • If possible, view your slides on the screen you'll be using for your presentation.

Guidelines for student presentations

Stay for the entire session. It is important to give each person presenting undivided attention and support. Leaving before or during a presentation can disrupt the presenter and is inconsiderate. It is also a good idea to have 10 copies of your paper available for interested individuals after your presentation.

Guidelines for Oral Presentations - Cornell College

Use decorative fonts only for slide headers, and then only if they're easy to read. Decorative fonts –calligraphy, German blackface, futuristic, psychotic handwriting, flowers, art nouveau, etc. – are hard to read and should be reserved only for large headlines at the top of the page.

10 Tips for More Effective PowerPoint Presentations

•Structure the presentation around an argument. Begin your analysis with a claim about why the scene functions as it does --the rest of the presentation should offer support for your argument. •All members of the group must take an equal role in the presentation.

Presentation Assignment and Guidelines

First, determine if you want or need students to do “live” (synchronous) presentations, attended by you and their peers. If not, students could record their presentations, which you and their peers could watch at your own pace (asynchronously) and then discuss. Live presentations. One method for presenting “live” is Zoom meetings. Students can share their screen and a video of themselves talking; attendees can view and hear, and ask questions.

Begin and end your presentation in a memorable way. If you use text, use bullet points, not sentences - aim for just one concept on a slide. The slides are for the audience; tell the story of your content and your topic through images. Talk off the presentation.
